
This booklet contains up to date information about arrangements for September 2021 and should be read in conjunction with the booklet issued for the rest of the school.

Dear Parents/Carers of children joining us in Year R,

We would like to begin by extending a warm welcome to all of the new families joining us in September. At South Borough, our vision is to provide excellence, enjoyment and inspiration in all areas of learning. We aim to develop a close relationship between home and school, and to work together with you in furthering your child's education.

Our school website has a dedicated area (New Year R Transition 2021), which includes documents and links that contain information about starting with us in September. Please take particular note of Section B on this page, as this section contains a number of forms that we would ask parents to complete and return as soon as possible. This includes a Google Form which provides us with information about your child's nursery, so that we can begin to gather relevant information from nursery settings about your child.

Dates for September 2021

We look forward to welcoming all of our new Year R children to school in September. Children will experience a staggered staff to school here at South Borough, beginning with stay and play sessions and gradually increasing their time as the weeks progress. This will be split over four weeks, which are outlined below. EYFS children will always enter and exit via Gate 1.

School Uniform



When your child starts with us in September, they will need to wear full school uniform in line with our school uniform policy which can be found on our website. Parents who already have children attending the school can use their ParentPay account to order uniform items with the school logo on. Parents who are new to the school can order uniform via the South Borough Website.

Once you have ordered your uniform you will need to contact the office to arrange a time for collection. Parents will be able to collect uniform from the 1st, 2nd & 3rd September.

Lunch Arrangements

Children in Year R will begin to stay for lunch **from Monday 20th September onwards**. During this week, we will take the time needed to guide the children through the processes of lunch times. Children in Year R will be part of the EYFS bubble and will eat their lunch in the hall with other children from this bubble. Children can either bring in a packed lunch or you can order them a cold packed lunch using your ParentPay account. All children in Year R are eligible for a free lunch.



Dropping children off in the morning




From **Monday 6th September onwards**, parents are asked to drop their child off at gate 1. Parents are not permitted to enter the wooden fenced area or the classroom. We understand that some children may find the separation from mum or dad tricky, especially at the beginning of their school life. We want to reassure you that staff will be on hand and will come to you at the gate to provide the necessary support for your child.


Contacting the teacher

Mrs Hunt and Mr Blanco will maintain regular contact by phone with parents/ carers about how children are settling in. Adults **will not be available to speak to you** at drop off and pick up unless they initiate the conversation with you. Teachers must commit their time to ensuring that all children safely enter or leave their care. Parents/carers can contact teachers through a phone call or email to the office if they have queries about the day.



Where do I drop my child/pick them up?








Social story for children

Rainbow Rules

We have Rainbow Rules, which will help you to make good choices. You will spend a lot of time learning about these when you start school. Before you start school, it is a good idea to read through these with your adults at home.



Snack

During the day you can have a snack at any time. You will find these at the snack table.

This is usually a piece of fruit or a vegetable.

School will give you a water bottle which you can take home every day to be cleaned.

You can have a drink of water whenever you like and fill your bottle up during the day when you need to.





Lunch

When you stay at school for lunch, you will eat it in the hall.

You will be able to sit with your friends.

An adult you know well will stay in your room while you eat. You will need to listen carefully to instructions when you have to tidy up.

You will need to bring in a packed lunch or order one from school everyday.





Reading

We hope you enjoy sharing books with your friends and families.

At school your teacher will read you a story every day. The reading area in our classroom is a special place to sit while you are looking at and reading books.

You will be able to find books about things you like. There are books about everything- dinosaurs, pirates and trains, fairy tales, animals and lots more!



Writing

Writing is fun! At school you will learn how to form letters correctly and later how to write sentences.

We write while we play all the time; in all of our learning areas. We write at every opportunity!





You will be able to do lots of other activities at school to help with your writing. These include drawing patterns, colouring, making models with play dough, cutting and drawing.







Maths

At school we do lots of mathematical activities. You will do lots of exciting things, such as counting forwards and backwards! Looking at shapes around us.

We will always try to go outside, even in wet weather.






You will have lots of fun learning both inside and outside.

Practise zipping up and unzipping your coat.








Practise putting on your shoes on. Are they on the correct feet?
