






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YEAR 3

This term, Year 3 have taken part in a range of experiences that have involved team building, designing and being creative! Our first experience day was themed around games. The children (and adults!) started by playing some well known games including Kerplunk, Snakes and Ladders. This then enabled the children to design and make their own game using cardboard. The results were fantastic! The children thought creatively about the concept of their games, whether it involved physical challenges like dancing and actions or using their brains to answer questions. Some also opted to create new adaptations of games they already knew.



The third of our experience days was all about Theme Parks. We began the day with team building activities and challenges including scavenger hunts, maze creating and building a tower from marshmallows and spaghetti! All the children were engaged, strategising in their teams to make the most complex maze and tallest and strongest tower. Using their new found knowledge of structures, the children were then able to design and make their own theme park rides from recycled materials. The designs and outcomes were amazing with groups providing a range of attractions from roller coasters to helter skelters and arcade boothe games. A lucky marble had the honour of testing the rides of our new theme park designers inventions and appeared to have a whirl of a time.

This week we look forward to our Invasion Day which will celebrate our term on Invasions in Broader Curriculum, coming to a close. The children have developed a wealth of knowledge on Invasions over a series of weeks and months, at home and in school. Each class will have a focus on Normans, Vikings or Anglo-Saxons. Having designed their shields and weapons they'll recreate invasion tactics and take part in activities relating to the life of their allocated invasion group.

YEAR 5


Year 5 have thoroughly enjoyed their Experience Days this term and arrived at the classroom for their first one to a brand new experience, a 'social breakfast', where they helped themselves to cereal and toast - and washed up afterwards! This alternative start to the day has proved so successful we have included it in all of our further Experience Days this term, with hot cross buns as an Easter theme at our most recent breakfast.

We have enjoyed a variety of activities and experiences, including a Team Building Day, where a superb array of paper aeroplanes were designed and the children's favourite, Pirate Game - a game of skill and cunning - was played. The afternoon culminated in a selection of board and card games for the children to enjoy as they reformed friendships, socialised with classmates and practised those all important turn taking skills. Our Ancient Greeks Experience Day, in line with our History topic, consisted of the children designing and building their own replica models of famous Greek temples, whilst in the afternoon we enjoyed a food tasting session, sampling and critiquing a selection of Greek foods. Interestingly, anchovies were not popular amongst Year 5 children!

Our most recent Experience Days have been led by the children's interests. Our Beautiful Birds Day was a real success, the children greatly enjoying collecting materials from the school grounds in order to make their own bird's nest, as well as creating the most beautiful bird collage art which we will be displaying in classrooms. As a result of the children's interest in this area, we have seen some fantastic report writing linked to British birds. Along a similar theme, our final Experience Day had a nature focus, with the children creating their own dream catcher, as well as using the afternoon to focus on chemical reactions in Science, where the children created slime. Much fun was had by all and we can truly say that the children in Year 5 have thoroughly enjoyed their Experience Days this term.

Since returning to the classroom, Year 1 pupils have really enjoyed a variety of Experience Days. These have all been around the main focus of re-establishing friendships and socialising again with other classmates.



To start us off we had an Indian themed experience day where we: sampled different Indian food and the students all discussed what they liked and disliked, as well as listening and joining in with some traditional Indian music and dancing.



Next we had a BIG focus on working well as a team where we encouraged team work, sharing, talking and listening to other people's ideas. The students were given the task of building the longest or tallest tower with only marshmallows and spaghetti as materials. After this we turned the playground into a swamp and, using a variety of PE equipment, the teams were tasked with travelling from one side of the 'swamp' to the other WITHOUT falling in and being eaten by a crocodile/their teacher!



Lastly we dived deeper by really thinking about what makes us the same and how we are unique. With the title 'All about Me' we looked at our physical features, using mirrors, drawing and painting LARGE self portraits and then we said or wrote 3 things we REALLY like about someone else and 1 thing the other person could try to work on. Later on in the day the students were given the additional option of creating finger puppets of

themselves or another member of the class.
