A Selection of activities children may be taking part in



- 1. <u>Archery</u>
- 2. Raft building
- **3.** Battering Ram High Ropes activity: safety equipment, climbing a ladder then making their way across battering rams using the wires and ropes to support themselves
- **4.**Bridge and swing Two activities. Bridges: Indiana and Postman's walk with stepping stones Swing: using a giant swing to get from one island to another
- High All Aboard High Ropes activity: Safety equipment, climbing up the pole using the blocks, standing up to 4 people on the platform. The group then lean out using each other to balance, and drop off the pole backwards
- Jacob's Ladder High Ropes activity: Safety equipment, the group must work as team to get their team up each 'rung' of the ladder. The gaps between the 'rungs' increase as you ascend
- **7.**Leap of Faith High Ropes activity: Safety equipment, a group member climbs the pole, stands on the platform at the top, counts down when ready and leaps for the buoy
- 8. Nightline Working in pairs, one is blindfolded, the other has to guide them verbally around a rope course in the woods.
- Vine Bridge High Ropes activity: safety equipment, climbing a ladder, then making their way across a bridge with one rope for their feet and vine ropes for their hands
- **10. Zipline** safety equipment, then climbing a ladder into the tree and going down an aerial runway

The centrepiece of the Swattenden site is a grand white mansion with high ceilings and large dormitory accommodation, games room with table tennis, pool and board games.

Rooms sleep boys and girls separately and contain bunk beds. Groups of between 8 and 12 children sleep in each room. There are additional bedrooms for teachers.
