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
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CELEBRATION OF LEARNING

Nursery

Happy New Year! We hope you all had a wonderful half term. Welcome to our new starters. They have settled well into the Nursery routine. Our topic this term is transport and we have talked about our experiences with transport. Our story this week is, 'Room on the Broom'. We are learning to retell the story using masks and stick puppets.



In Phonics we have looked at rhyming words and the initial sound in words. In Mathematics we have been changing amounts (numbers) by adding and taking away using cups of tea, ordering food at a restaurant and putting children/ animals on a broom.

Our big question this term is "How can I change the world?" We will be talking about what we can do to make the world a better place for us to grow. We've been discussing our goals and dreams and we'll work hard to achieve them.

Reception

Happy New Year and welcome back! We hope you had a nice break and charged the batteries for the new term. This week we've been looking at "Room on the Broom" and enjoyed making our own brooms and practising "magic rhyming spells".



We will be talking about what we can do to make the world a better place for us to grow. We've been discussing our goals and dreams and we'll work hard to achieve them.

In Maths we have been looking at number composition, thinking about different ways of making the same number (1+4=5, 2+2+1=5) and comparing quantities to see which group has more/fewer.

Please continue to support your children with their learning at home and have fun while learning together.



Year 1

Year 1 have had a roarsome start to the new term! We have been learning all about dinosaurs. This week, we had a special dinosaur experience day, where we had a virtual visit to Maidstone Museum and learnt all about fossils and how they were formed. In English, we have been reading Tyrannosaurus Drip. We have been practising our descriptive language by designing our own dino habitats.



In Maths, we have been working with numbers to 20, comparing them in different ways. In Science, we have been learning about winter and have been spending time outside exploring ice. We found ice triangles, rectangles and even ice in the shape of dinosaur teeth! We have compared winter in England and Finland, where it is much colder.



We have been learning about the northern lights and created some artwork with chalk showing the magical dancing colours in the dark night sky.




Year 2

Welcome back to Term 3. Year 2 have had a brilliant return to school. In the last week, we have been looking at the big question 'How can I change the world?'. Please discuss this with your children at home as they have some brilliant ideas!

This term, we are looking at multiplication and division in maths and the children have made a great start practising arrays using cubes and pictures.

We have started our new class novel, 'The boy who grew dragons'. The children are really enjoying the story and learning about dragons. Please continue to read for 10 minutes daily with your child as this makes a big difference to their learning.

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CELEBRATION OF LEARNING




Year 3

It has been fantastic to see the children return to school with such enthusiasm and excitement about their learning.

We are all reading *The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane* by Kate DiCamillo which the children are really enjoying. We are using this to support our writing of a diary entry where we will write as if we were Edward as he is thrown overboard into the Pacific Ocean.

In Maths we are now finishing our work on multiplication and division and we will be moving onto money which will include calculating change. Please support your child with their recognition of the different coins and paper money.

The children have been eager to share their knowledge of Europe as part of our Geography lessons. We have been using Google Earth to find out more about our amazing planet.



Year 4

Year 4 have made an enthusiastic return to school! We have got stuck in with our big question 'How can I change the world?' by discussing our dreams and goals for the future, we will continue to build upon these as the term continues.

For our first piece of writing, we are exploring ways we can change the world through the way we live in it by writing a non-chronological report. We have looked at 'What a Waste' to support our writing and discussed key environmental issues.

We have started our new maths topic of division. We have been dividing 2-digit numbers by a 1-digit, using our previous knowledge of place value, multiplication and the resources in our classroom. We have persevered exploring remainders.

We are enjoying discovering the continent North America in our geography lessons. We have used atlases to locate the 23 countries and explored the climate.

Year 5

Year 5 have had an amazing start to 2022. We have already began to explore our big question "How can I change the world" by thinking about our goals and dreams of the future. We will have a continued focus on this as the term progresses.

We have started our work on multiplication, by looking at multiplying 4 digits by 1 digit. Please continue to support your children with their multiplication at home as this will be invaluable to support with their progress.

In English, we have been having fun learning about narrative poems and will be contributing our own stanzas to the poem 'Grannie' by Vernon Scannell.

We have been exploring the continent South America. So far, the children have focussed on discovering facts about the different countries and their flags.



Year 6

Happy New Year and welcome back to Term 3. The children have returned to school refreshed and eager to learn and have enthusiastically accepted our Big Question challenge by identifying an impressive range of goals and dreams for the future. Some children were even brave enough to share their goals in our assembly this week! The children have discussed many ways they think they can change the world and it has been heartening to hear the empathy they have shown when considering causes they would like to help. There has been much talk of fundraising as a result.

We are continuing our WWII learning this term and in History have been using our learning of key figures to help us create micrography - the process of writing information over a traced photograph.

We had our first swimming lesson this week, and although some of Yr6 felt a little nervous beforehand, a great time was had by all and we are looking forward to going back next week.
