# CELEBRATION OF LEARNING

#### Nursery

The story of the week has been, 'The Great Race' by Emily Hiles. We have talked about different ideas of how to cross the river.



We have researched Chinese New Year, why is it celebrated and how.

In Phonics, we are developing our understanding of rhyming words and hearing the initial sound in words. In Mathematics, we are using vocabulary of full, empty, more, less and the same to describe and compare capacities. We are also using vocabulary to describe and compare time (lunchtime, teatime, now, later, later than or earlier than).

We have worked on being more independent with putting on our own coats, zipping them up and putting on shoes. Please encourage your child to be independent with putting on their coats and zipping.

#### Year 1

Year 1 have been getting outdoors as much as possible this term learning about plants as part of our Science

topic. We have been on a plant and tree hunt around the school and have been learning about the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees.



In English, we have been reading 'Dear Dinosaur' and practising our letter writing skills. We will be writing a letter to Maidstone Museum asking them all the questions that we have about dinosaurs!

We have been focusing on adding and subtracting in Maths, using lots of objects like dinosaurs, Lego and bears to help us with counting forwards and backwards.

In Computing, we have been learning how to program a Bee-bot using different algorithms and debugging when things go wrong. We have had lots of fun guiding the Bee-bot to different places around the classroom!







Our new story book is called "The Great Race" written and illustrated by Emily Hiles, which explains the story of the Chinese Zodiac. The Jade Emperor challenges twelve animals to a race, a race across a river! Who will be first?

We have enjoyed looking at and making different types of boats. We have created lanterns and dragons to wish our class luck! Chinese New Year is on Tuesday 1st February, Reception classes will be tasting noodles, rice and reading fortune cookies too!

In Maths we are learning about mass and comparing weights. We are having fun using scales to weigh different sized teddies and toys. Also, we have been looking at capacity and talking about how much a container can hold.

This term our 'Big Question' is 'How can I change the world?', the children have decided that **recycling** is a great idea. We have started to collect scrap paper and will begin making our own recycled paper!

#### Year 2

The children in Year 2 have worked very hard over the last couple of weeks. Everybody really enjoyed our plant experience day last Friday. The children took part in making their own flower pots out of paper and then had a go at planting a seed. We have our seeds by the window so that they get lots of light and the children will monitor how they grow over the rest of the term.

Our science day has also led into our class writing, as we have looked at different versions of 'Jack and the beanstalk', ready to write our own twisted tale. We have continued to read 'The boy who grew dragons' as our class text and the children are enjoying the story immensely. Please continue to read with your child at home for at least 10 minutes each day.





# CELEBRATION OF LEARNING

#### Year 3

Year 3 have worked hard to write some amazing diary entries as if they were Edward Tulane. The children have strived to use sophisticated language to describe the events of Edward's life - well done to all of Year 3!

In maths, the children have now begun the topic of money. We have been looking at adding and subtracting money and will move onto calculating change and problem solving. Please continue to support your child with money at home.

The children have been excited to begin their European fact file in geography. Over the next few lessons, the children will use atlases, webpages and non-fiction books to gather information about their chosen country and use this information as well as their creative skills to design their fact file.

#### Year 4

The children in Year 4 have been working extremely hard over the last couple of weeks. We have been looking at ways we can change the world environmentally, based on our own online research. This has led to the children producing fantastic non-chronological reports about pollution and ways we can reduce pollution in our world.

We have also continued learning online in our computing lessons, by creating book review webpages. We have begun designing our very own websites using Google Sites. These are linked to our learning about North America, as the children are creating them based on their chosen country.

In maths we have explored how to calculate the area of shapes, using our knowledge of multiplication facts to support us. The children are becoming increasingly more confident in recalling their times tables, please continue to practise these at home.

#### Year 5

The children in Year 5 have all been working extremely hard over the past couple of weeks. They have persevered with their learning and have tackled everything with enthusiasm.

We have begun looking at our next piece of writing, a persuasive letter. The children will be writing a letter to help save the rainforest, which links to our big question 'How can you change the world?'

In maths we have been learning about division and multiplication. We have introduced multiplying by 2 digit numbers and division using the 'bus stop' method. We are now moving on to fractions so please talk to your children about what they already know.

The children have recently compared the physical geographical features between the United Kingdom and South America. We have also made 3D maps of South America, showing the rivers, highlands and coastal plains.

#### Year 6

In Year 6, the children have produced some fantastic pieces of writing based on the story of Rose Blanche - a WW2 story! They should be extremely proud of the work they have produced - we certainly are!

In Science, we have started a new topic focussed on light. This week, the children had to prove that light travelled in straight lines and reflects off a surface. With the use of light boxes and mirrors, the children produced light maps that were able to prove this fact!

As well as continuing to learn to swim, our Physical Education lessons have been focussing on Carnival Dance. The children have been creating routines and performing these to one another. They have continued to show their understanding of PE and developed communication skills, through critiquing and improving other performances.
