## **CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK**

This week is Children's Mental Health Week. We will be enjoying lots of activities to promote and discuss mental health throughout the week. Supported by Place2Be, the theme of this year's Children's Mental Health Week is '*Growing Together*'. Growing Together is about growing emotionally and finding ways to help each other grow.
