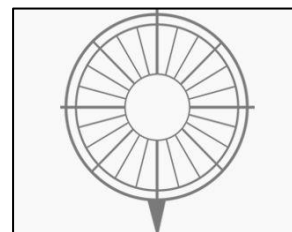

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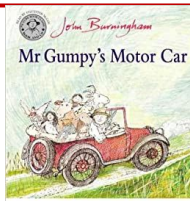
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CELEBRATION OF LEARNING

Reception

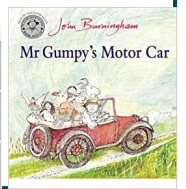
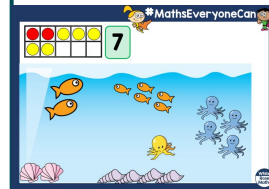
This week we have been learning about a new story called 'Mr Gumpy's Motor Car' related to our 'Transport' topic. We have been using cars to paint and observe the marks the wheels leave on the paper. We have driven cars to write numbers with them.

In Maths we have been looking at combining two groups and learning about addition and the symbols used to write number sentences.

In Phonics we have finished set 2 sounds, and we're looking forward to starting set 3 next term.

Also this week we have celebrated 'Children's Mental Health' and we have been listening to calming music and concentrating on our breathing.

Children have worked really hard and achieved their Dojo target so they have had their Dojo reward parties. Have a lovely break and see you soon!



Year 1

Year 1 have absolutely loved our dinosaurs topic this term! We have had lots of fun learning to say their tricky names and finding out lots of facts about them. In English, we have been reading 'The Girl and the Dinosaur' and have been writing a diary entry pretending to be the girl in the story. We have practised writing in the past tense and asking questions, using a question mark at the end of our sentences. In Maths, we have been working with bigger numbers and have been reading and representing numbers up to 50. In Science, we have planted some sunflower seeds. We are going to have a competition between the 2 classes to see who can grow the tallest sunflower! We have also planted broad beans and we hope to move them outside into our planting area once it gets warmer. In RE, we have been learning about different places of worship including the mosque, synagogue and church. Wishing you all a restful half term break!



Year 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic end to Term 3. We have continued to observe the plants that we planted on our experience day. You can see from the pictures below that they have grown lots! We have ended our learning about 'How can I change the world?' by celebrating mental health week. We have looked at how our emotions can affect ourselves and others.

This term, the children have produced some wonderful work. We are particularly proud of the children's own versions of Jack and the beanstalk where Jack met chocolate monsters and even dragons! As well as this the children have persevered with their fractions learning. Well done Year 2, have a lovely half term.





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Year 3

Year 3 had great fun on Tuesday with their Culture Day where they were able to build on their Geography learning. The children created art laying on their backs as if they were Michelangelo, became sculptures as they made well-known European landmarks from clay and thoroughly enjoyed sampling a Dutch breakfast of HagelSlag.



In English, the children have continued to think about the text *The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane* and have used this to write their own Haiku poems.

In maths, the children have continued their learning of statistics where the children have persevered in creating their own bar graphs.

Year 4

Year 4 have ended the term with a fantastic week of learning! This week the children continued exploring 'how they can change the world' in their Robotics and Coding workshop. The children worked together to create and code a prototype of the Mars Rover.

In English, the children have been writing Haiku poems, which is a form of Japanese poetry. The children have worked hard to ensure they have the correct syllables in each line whilst writing about flowers blooming in spring.

In Maths, children have mastered the method of short division. They have persevered in dividing two-digit and three-digit numbers by a one-digit number.

In Music, the children have continued learning the lyrics to the song 'Stop!'. This week the children performed the song together and added their own choreography!



Year 5

Year 5 have had an amazing end to our term! We had a successful trip to Wingham Wildlife Park, taking part in a Rainforest S.O.S talk. We also had a look around at the animals to see which ones we may find in the Amazon rainforest! This trip helped us with our English and Geography.

In Maths, the children have been working hard to master fractions. We have dived into equivalent fractions and how to convert between mixed and improper ones. As always, please support your children in learning their multiplication as this will help them with this topic.

We have also begun investigating light in our science topic. So far, the children have recognised that light travels in straight lines and that we need a light source to be able to see. We will be continuing our light topic next term.

Year 6

Year 6 have had an incredible end to Term 3! As part of our Big Question, the children decided that they wanted to raise money for Cancer Research UK and Sea Life Trust - in order to help change the world! They raised a fantastic £270!! Each charity will receive half of the money raised.

The children also had a very successful World War II Day. They created WW2 inspired artwork as well as learning bandaging skills and discussing simple first aid. During the afternoon the children hosted a showcase of their learning to parents. They sang songs, shared readings and proudly took the opportunity to show off their WWII learning. They should be extremely proud of their hard work.

In Maths, as well as continuing to develop their arithmetic skills, the children have begun to conquer algebra. They have been learning about equations and substitution and are increasing in confidence with this sometimes tricky concept.
