




CELEBRATION OF LEARNING

Nursery

In Nursery, we have been learning about the book 'Molly Rogers to the Rescue' by Cornelia Funke. We've enjoyed reading the different chapters in the book and talked about the different adventures happening. We have been busy creating pirate ships, treasure chests and treasure using plasticine on the messy table. We have made our own pirate hats for our treasure hunt (see dojo reward letter for more information).











As the weather has been really hot, we have talked about the importance of staying hydrated and keeping safe in the sun. We have also talked about the impact exercise has on our bodies - the heart beating quicker, the change in breathing, feeling warmer, sweating and feeling thirsty.

As some nursery children will be moving on to Reception at South Borough Primary School or at other Primary Schools, we have spent some time talking about changes. Using Jigsaw Jenie, we explained how he is feeling scared about going to Reception class. We then spoke about cheering him up by talking about the exciting things about Reception class and what the children are excited about.









In Maths and Phonics we have been reviewing previous learning to make sure that we can remember everything that we have learned during the year.













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In English, Year 1 have now finished writing a diary entry about Bob - The man on the Moon. We took on the role of Bob and wrote in the past tense about all the exciting things that he did during his day.

We have also been writing about why we think we would make good astronauts, thinking about all the skills and traits that we would need to have to do this difficult job.





We have been getting excited about the Women's Euros. Each class has been given a team in a sweepstake across the school and we have been enjoying supporting England and learning more about our given teams, Denmark (1H) and France (1B).





In Maths, we have been learning about time. We have been reading time on clocks using o'clock and half past. We have also been thinking about different lengths of time and how long tasks and activities take to do.



We have been learning about the astronaut Chris Hadfield, who took lots of videos during his time aboard the International Space Station. It was fun watching him do different tasks in zero gravity! We have also enjoyed reading the book that he wrote to inspire others to face their fears and follow their dreams. The other week, we spent time in our new classrooms with our new teachers. We have been talking a lot about change and how change can be very positive and exciting, thinking about how much we have changed over the year in Year 1, as well as how much we have all changed since we were babies.

The other week, Year 2 had a very exciting time visiting their new classrooms and meeting their new teachers. The children are now looking forward to Year 3 and are especially keen to learn about Ancient Greece.

Following on from their visit to their new classes, Year 2 have been writing a letter to their new teachers. They have included lots of information about themselves, their likes and dislikes and have also talked about how they feel about next year.

We have been closely following Euro 22. Each class has been given a team in a sweepstake across the school and both classes are enjoying supporting both England and our given teams, Belgium and Norway.



The children had a fantastic time at the art exhibition. They loved seeing their own artwork up on the wall and they also enjoyed getting to see the artwork that had been created by other years. The colourful lions that they had created in art this term looked amazing and the children were very proud of the effort that they had put in.



We have been enjoying the story of The Tear Thief. The children have been retrieving information from the text and have made some predictions about what might happen next in the story. In Maths, the children have been looking at finding fractions. They have explored 1/4, 1/2 3/4 and 1/3 and can now find these fractions of an amount.

In English, the children have now finished writing their descriptions of a house which they should be very proud of as they were able to showcase how they can effectively use a range of sophisticated vocabulary and include other literary devices such as alliteration. Our last piece of writing this year is a poem based on The Magic Box by Kit Wright. The children have been thinking about what imaginative things they could store inside their own magic box and they have been producing some fantastic ideas! Ranging from a luxurious beach and an exploding supernova to the smell of freshly baked bread or the taste of sticky, sweet honey. They have been putting their knowledge to good use by using their fabulous ideas to create a poem.

The children have had lots of fun during their science lessons. We have been learning about classification. To demonstrate our understanding we went out into the playground and spent some time looking in shaded places and underneath objects to see what insects we could find. In maths, Year 3 have been finding out all about different measurements. The children explored mass (kg and g) and we have been looking at volume and capacity (I and mI). We took advantage of the beautiful weather and took the learning outside and used water to investigate volume and capacity.





In geography, the children have been furthering their understanding of maps and, following our dojo reward prize of a trip to South Park, the children have been creating their own sketch maps of the route we took.

The children spent time visiting their new classes, classrooms and teachers and whilst for many this is a big change they are all looking forward to the challenges of Year 4.








CELEBRATION OF LEARNING

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On Tuesday July 5th, the Year 4 students went on a field trip to South Park as part of our Geography learning this term. During the trip, the students looked at different land uses in the area. Once we were there, we had a close look at South Park and students assessed the environmental quality of the area based on what they observed. From there, students were able to suggest some changes and improvements they would like to see in the area, and presented their findings with great confidence to the class. Well done to the students, for their excellent behaviour during the trip, and to the adults who supported us!









Science

In Science we have explored food chains. We have learned about consumers and producers and then created our own food chains.

The students have been exploring a new and exciting text type; vlogs! They have been busy planning a speech to record as a vlog for their new Year 5 teachers. I'm sure you are looking forward to seeing their speeches!

<u>Maths</u>

As we draw to a close in their maths learning, the students have shown how much they know about shapes and their properties, and can apply their knowledge to more tricky topics such as translations.

Art Exhibition

Year 4 made animal collages using a variety of different media to make the pattern feather background. They then applied their knowledge of the properties of art to make the animal's facial features. Year 5

English

The students have been working hard on a new and exciting text type; Graphic Novels! They have had to consider how to include speech and captions to work alongside their artwork to tell a part of the story which we have been reading called 'When Stars are Scattered'. The children are really engaging well with this true story about refugees in Kenya and are keen to find out what actually happened to the lead protagonists, Omar and Hassan. We hope to have revealed the final part of the story before we break for the holidays.



<u>PSHE</u>

We have now come to the end of our work on puberty and the changes which will affect us in the coming years for the time being. The children have been very mature throughout and now seem to be able to look forward understanding that changes are a fact of life and with support from our teachers, friends and family we can cope with anything. They are certainly growing into fine young ladies and gentlemen.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths we have been working on our measurements. Converting between different units of measurement (both metric and imperial) and more recently beginning to work on understanding what volume is and how to calculate the volume of cuboids.

Well done to all of Year 5 who participated in Sports Day. You showed great team spirit and bravery, giving everything your best efforts. We were so proud of you.


Art Exhibition
