Offer an enhanced range of lunchtime activities for all pupils.</p>	<p>Funding for the OPAL programme has significantly enhanced lunchtime engagement, particularly evident in ball games where new aluminium goals and balls have fostered broader participation.</p> <p>The purchase of scooters has successfully established a dedicated wheeled toy zone, actively supporting children in developing new physical skills and promoting active play.</p> <p>The introduction of outdoor radios has diversified lunchtime activities by enabling dance and keep-fit sessions, significantly broadening the range of physical engagement opportunities for all pupils.</p>	<p>Continue to expand the lunch time offer of activities. Use lunch time as an opportunity to increase participation of those 'less active' pupils.</p>	<p>£3809.98</p>
<p>2. Establish a team of Sports Ambassadors who contribute to raising the profile of Sport across the school.</p>	<p>Expenditure on equipment like badminton sets and cross-country gear directly supported Sports Ambassadors in successfully organizing and delivering engaging intra-school competitions, significantly raising the profile of these sports.</p> <p>The provision of key equipment such as tennis balls, slalom poles, training vests, and volleyballs has enabled Sports Ambassadors to effectively assist in PE lessons, fostering peer leadership and improving lesson delivery.</p> <p>By equipping Sports Ambassadors with necessary resources for both competitions and lesson support, the school has successfully established a proactive team that demonstrably contributes to higher sports engagement and a raised profile for physical activity school-wide.</p>	<p>Embed the Sports Leader programme with pupils actively promoting physical activity within the school.</p>	<p>£963.84</p>

Improve the quality of all PE lessons for all pupils.</p>	<p>Expert coaching and modelling, has significantly boosted staff confidence and abilities, leading to a greatly enhanced overall quality of PE lesson delivery across the school.</p> <p>Professional coaches have successfully upskilled teachers and support staff in key areas such as planning, resourcing, modelling, and assessment, directly improving the breadth and depth of PE provision for all pupils.</p> <p>Every pupil now consistently receives at least two hours of high-quality PE per week.</p>	<p>Continue to take a needs led approach to PE/Sports CPD.</p> <p>Use expert coaches to work alongside teachers to upskill them in other areas of the sports curriculum (eg: O&AA; striking and fielding games)</p>	<p>£8358</p>
<p>4. Develop inclusivity of sporting opportunities across the school (especially for disadvantaged and SEND pupils).</p>	<p>Funding for Teamtheme after-school clubs directly enabled greater access and engagement in sporting interests for pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds, broadening their active participation. These clubs included football, hockey, badminton, tennis and basketball.</p> <p>The fully funded Bikeability course significantly boosted road cycling confidence and safety skills for Year 6 pupils, while the in-school Boccia tournament successfully engaged all children, promoting inclusivity regardless of ability.</p>	<p>Continue to fund after school sporting opportunities for vulnerable pupils.</p> <p>Focus on expanding girls football to Y3/4.</p>	<p>£5042</p>
<p>5. Increase opportunities for pupils to take part in a range of sports competitions.</p>	<p>The school's subscription to the local PASS competition package significantly increased opportunities for pupils to compete in inter-school events, including netball, football, and cross-country running.</p> <p>Pupils demonstrated outstanding competitive spirit and skill, with the netball team securing first place in both their league and cup, and the girls' football team achieving a commendable third place in their league, alongside our first-time entry into gymnastics competitions.</p> <p>The purchase of medals, equipment, and trophies for the annual Sports Day effectively celebrated and reinforced the inclusion of all children in competitive sporting events within the school.</p>	<p>Embed competitions both within the school and within the wider community.</p> <p>Further enhance opportunities for competition, including new sports such as competitive swimming and building on gymnastics competitions.</p>	<p>£1726.18</p>
